Choosing your treatment

Viagra, Cialis or Levitra all work in a similar way. Your pharmacist will help you choose a suitable medication and recommend a starting dose.

Viagra (25mg, 50mg, or 100mg)
Familiar, lasts about 4 hours

Levitra (5mg, 10mg or 20mg)
Works more quickly, last about 12 hours

Cialis (10mg or 20mg)
Increasingly prescribed, lasts up to 36 hours
